A PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, pursuant to section six, article five, chapter fifteen of the Code of West Virginia, I declared a State of Emergency in forty-four counties of the State of West Virginia on the twenty-third day of June, Two Thousand Sixteen, as a result of a severe storm event that caused, among other things, significant rainfall, rockslides, mudslides, flooding, property damage and loss of human life; and

WHEREAS, emergency conditions have been abated in all but twelve counties of West Virginia, and State and Federal first responders and emergency managers and the West Virginia National Guard have transitioned from coordinating emergency preparations and response efforts to recovery efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EARL RAY TOMBLIN, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of West Virginia, and in view of the foregoing, do hereby **TERMINATE** the State of Emergency proclaimed on the twenty-third day of June, Two Thousand Sixteen, in the counties of Barbour, Boone, Braxton, Cabell, Calhoun, Doddridge, Gilmer, Harrison, Lewis, Logan, Marion, Mason, McDowell, Mercer, Mingo, Monongalia, Pendleton, Pleasants, Preston, Putnam, Raleigh, Randolph, Ritchie, Taylor, Tucker, Tyler, Upshur, Wayne, Wetzel, Wirt, Wood, and Wyoming. It is hereby **ORDERED** that the State of Emergency shall remain in force and effect in the counties of Clay, Fayette, Greenbrier, Jackson, Kanawha, Lincoln, Monroe, Nicholas, Pocahontas, Roane, Summers, and Webster until 5:00 p.m. on Friday, the twenty-third day of July, Two Thousand Sixteen, unless extended by subsequent Proclamation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of West Virginia to be affixed.
